Time Requirements:	Junior (School Grades 5-7)	6-10 Minutes
	Intermediate (School Grades 8-9)	9-14 Minutes
	Seniors (School Grades 10-12)	12-18 Minutes

Recital: All contestants must attend and play one piece for the recital. In the event of duplication of the selected recital piece, only the earliest postmarked entry will play the piece. The teacher of the student will be notified if there is duplication. The recitals will follow the auditions. Depending on the entries, the recitals should begin sometime around 3:00. Winners are announced and cash awards are given at the conclusion of each recital.

The recitals will be held in the Sanctuary of the Church. The exact times will be mailed to the participating studios and posted on the website by February 20th.

Attire: Students should dress as they would to attend an important interview or as a guest at a formal wedding. Shoes (on the feet) will be required for both performances.

Audition Times: Students should plan to be available all day. A lottery system will be used for scheduling. Any serious scheduling conflicts will be considered. If there are any conflicts, notify the chair by the entry deadline. Auditions will run from around 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. and an audience will be allowed.

General Requirements:

- OMTA Teacher dues must have been paid by September 1, 2009.
- No changes, deletions or additions in repertoire will be allowed after the deadline.
- Repeats should be omitted unless needed to complete the piece properly.
- Only published scores will be allowed for the judge. NO PHOTOCOPIES
- Downloaded music with written permission from the publisher will be allowed.
- Repertoire must be originally written for the instrument. No arrangements.
- Measures must be numbered.
- There will be one judge for each division.
- Students must perform on the recital to qualify for any prize.
